SONOS COMMISSIONS TWO AMERICAN COMPOSERS

On May 13, SONOS will make its Merkin Concert Hall debut with two new commissions: world premieres by James Nyoraku Schlefer and Brian Wilbur Grundstrom, and two beautiful, yet little known works by Ralph Vaughn Williams and Finish composer, Pehr Henrik Nordgren.

Mr. Grundstrom's piece, American Reflections, scored for string orchestra and harp, evokes an atmosphere of an America past. One definitely hears influences from the Amish country in Pennsylvania, as well as a touch of New York City/ modern day harmony. This is Mr. Grundstrom's second commission from SONOS.

Mr. Schlefer, a Grand Master of the shakuhachi (Japanese bamboo flute), has composed for smaller ensembles before, but his Concerto for Shakuhachi and Chamber Orchestra is his first orchestral composition. Not to add any pressure to him, but he is also the soloist in the piece! Here, an American soundscape has truly been put through the ringer, and is filtered through a wide range of experience with World music, traditional Japanese music, pop and jazz. Cool!

"MUSIC WITH A VIEW"

On February 1, members of SONOS Chamber Orchestra performed the US premiere of Derrik Jordan's Sky Mirror, for string quartet, shakuhachi, and electric guitar as part of "Music with a View", a program sponsored by The Flea Theater.

Sky Mirror won the Best New Composition Award at the International Shakuhachi Convention, which was held in Australia last July. It was a huge success, combining traditional effects for shakuhachi with inventive rhythms and sounds from the electric guitar. Also on the program was a Table Music for two violins by Ralph Farris (violist of the amplified and improvising string quartet ETHEL).

Table Music is a challenging piece, not least to mention that the two violinists are reading the same piece of sheet music across the table from one another! One starts at the top, one starts at the bottom, and they cross in the middle.


On March 1, 2009, three people were invited to join the Board of Directors, and one person was invited to join the Advisory Board.



GHOST OPERA



On March 20, 2009, Members of SONOS Chamber Orchestra performed at the Tenri Cultural Institute with shakuhachi Grand Master James Nyoraku Schlefer, and pipa virtuoso Min Xiao Fen.

The first half of the concert featured music for string quartet and shakuhachi opening with the U.S. premiere of James Cuddeford's Impermanence, in memory of Karlheinz Stockhausen. Almost in the forms of a meditation, this ethereal piece creates an atmosphere of bending shapes and sounds. The second piece, Quintet for string quartet and shakuhachi, featured the driving rhythms of James Nyoraku Schlefer. The composer also performed the solo shakuhachi part.

The second half rocked (literally) with Tan Dun's visual and aural feast, Ghost Opera for string quartet and pipa. Players had to be trained to play water, rocks, paper, and Chinese opera cymbals, and they learned to vocalize in Peking opera style! The performance was a huge success, including lighting, sound, and a small set.
